Ajarn Shu Li: And the last question, what do you get from this experience?

QNU Students: In our opinions, all the benefits provided by BRU are brilliant for us!

We can learn and share language and culture in our 2 months here to enhance our skills better than before. We now know more about Thai culture especially, the respect to elders by always using a "Wai" and the good manners of Thai society. #### TOPIC TEST

On the 16<sup>th</sup> December 2017, the Language Center, Language Development Division, International Office, Buriram Rajabhat University cooperated with the Educational Testing Service (ETS) to organize a TOEIC test (Test of English for International Communication).

The TOEIC test is a national standardized assessment for Business English skills. There are many institutes and organizations that required a TOEIC score to be considered for employee recruitment. Aeronautic businesses, hotels, tourism sectors, associated business as well as other multinational companies are a few of the types companies and business that require TOEIC for job placement. The test was held at the meeting rooms in Building 19 and Building 22. The 141 examinees took part. Before testing, each examinee was strictly checked by the proctors, led by Ajarn Pallapa Lertjaroenwanich, Head of the Language Center, with a metal detector. The examinees were only allowed to bring their identification cards or their student ID cards into the test room.




# We Warmly Welcome Administrators and Students from Shangrao Normal University, China

### EDO Training for Freshmen 2017



From the 11<sup>th</sup> July to 20<sup>th</sup> July 2017,

English Discoveries Online Project (EDO) was organized by the Language Development Division, International Office, for Buriram Rajabhat University's freshmen, academic year 2017. The purposes of this project are 1) to guide students in using the English Discoveries Online Program, and 2) to enhance BRU students' English proficiency. The English Discoveries Online is an interactive program covering four language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing that allow students to access and explore learning English on their own. Around 3,440 BRU freshmen have to take a placement test so they know their English proficiency level before they start learning the program. Evaluation results from this online course will account for 20% of the General English Courses taken at BRU.



### Training Workshop on Blended Learning Solution



On the 11<sup>th</sup> October 2017, Ms. Rosesamon Panduangkaew, Director of the International Office, together with Ms. Purisa Watcharenwong, Head of Language Development were invited to attend a training workshop on "An Effective Blended Learning Solution-Overcoming Pedagogical and Technological Challenges in Thailand" organized by IT Edusoft Co., Ltd. at the Royal River Hotel, Bankok. A workshop was given so that all participants could experience the three stages of PPP: Present, Practice, and Production (pre, computer and post) for communicative English. In the afternoon session, the participants discussed on learning assessment--Edusoft approach to learning and the tools available. Besides, a role of the teacher in the blended environment was being shared and integrated on lesson planning in English Discoveries.
